364 WELLES TABLE

Welles Table makes generous use of solid wood with an elegantly simple form. The tabletop, detailed with a central divide and angled edges, is set upon cast iron legs. This table is quietly functional while remaining approachable and appealing to the senses.

Welles, named after Orson Welles, is part of a family of furniture, its material combination also found on McQueen Chests and Orson Desk.



MATERIALS

TIMBER

Black walnut, white oak, or ash with a choice of a clear Danish oil, white oil, or black oil finish. White oak additionally available oxidised; ash additionally available stained or painted in a choice of 10 colours: black, white, bone, ochre, bordeaux, forest, fjord, bay, lagoon, or cove.

METAL

Cast iron legs.
